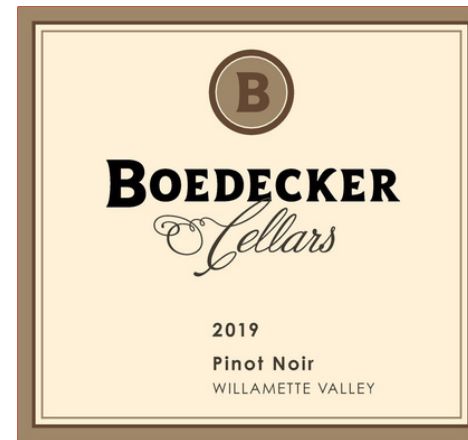

That decadent theme continues on the palate as cherry compote, citrus and juniper berry flavors mix it up. I would consider pairing this wine with a picnic blanket and a good paperback.

The makeup

This is your everyday Pinot Noir that's crafted from the same vineyards, in the same style, as the wines you cellar. It is full bodied and full of black raspberry with a little bit of pomegranate flavors mixed in, with aromatics that remind us of hiking in the spring.

The methodology

Organically driven from vineyard to bottle. Sorted by hand in the vineyard and winery, fermented in small open top 1.5ton fermenters.

30% whole cluster, spontaneous ferments from the indigenous primary yeast, naturally occurring malolactic bacteria, lees stirring during elevage, aged 9 months in French oak barrels and minimal effective So2.

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
