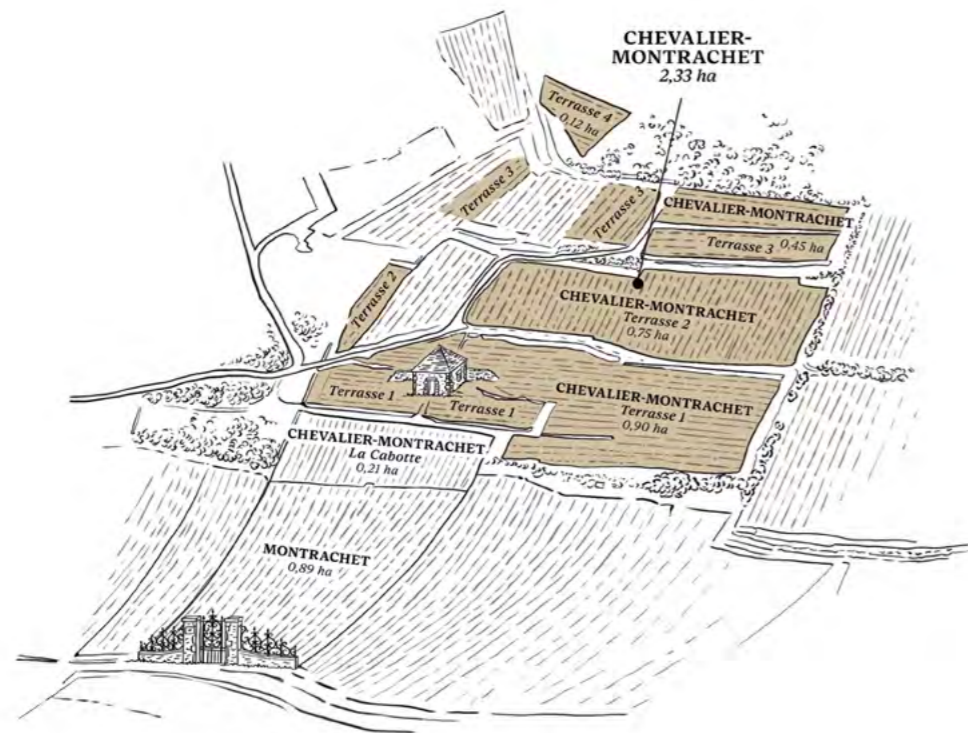


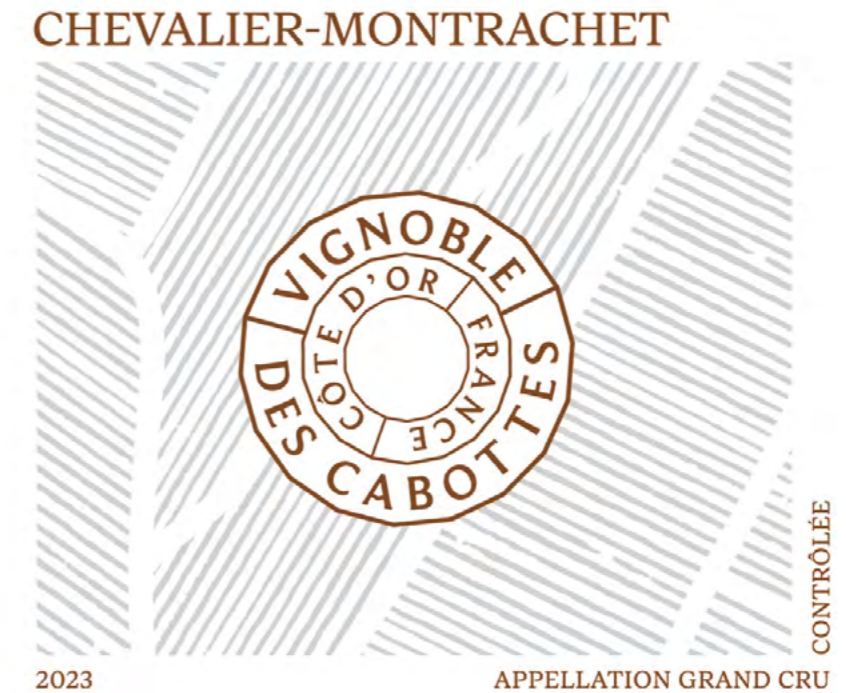
Chevalier-Montrachet Grand Cru

Its name is said to come from the son of the lord of Montrachet, a young knight who went on the Crusades. The terroir, spread across four terraces on the slopes of Mont Chauve, sits on very poor limestone soil and produces a wine of uncompromising purity—straight, precise and long.

- Acquisition date: 1838
- Surface: 2.33 hectares
- Altitude: 280 meters
- Soils: very poor calcareous marl
- Exposure: East / South-East

“A subtle and elegant first nose, with floral notes (rose, linden), and aromas of citrus and verbena. The palate is noble and citrusy, rich yet very precise, with a very long saline finish. An expressive wine.”
